Sources and notes appear below the table, aligned left. All tables must be in portrait orientation.

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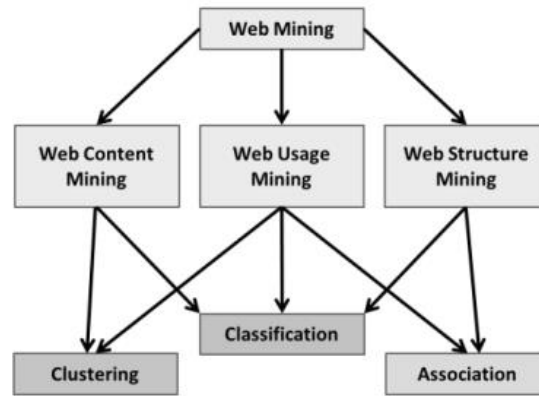


Figure 1. Classes of Web Mining
